Nomination	The partner university must send us <a href="#">this nomination form</a> by <b>March 10</b> for Fall entry or by <b>September 1</b> for Winter entry.
Online application	Information about the online application will be sent directly to partners upon receiving the nomination form.

Application deadlines	Fall semester (September to December) and full academic year (September to April) : <b>April 1</b>
	Winter semester (January to April) : <b>September 15</b>
Official answer	Please note admission is not guaranteed. The official letter of admission will be available online on the "Centre Étudiant" once the academic department accepts the application. This letter is the official document to be used for visa/study permit application.

## Language requirements

Université de Montréal is a French taught institution and almost all courses are held in French. A minimum B2 level (from the Common European framework) certificate/letter delivered by an accredited institution (home university's Department of Languages, French Alliance, School of Languages, etc.) is required to most programs of study.

Some departments may require a higher level; see below for the list of programs with particular requirements.

French courses: non-francophone students can take one 3-credit French course at our Language School. Students will be charged course materials fees (about 25 \$ per credit).

A placement test is mandatory. Information will be sent to students.

## Academic Information

Course registration	Exchange students must choose only one UdeM study program and courses corresponding to this chosen program. Most of the programs are accessible to exchange students. Students must be enrolled on a full-time basis.
